Reported crime in Zone 2 is down over past month, but robberies in Zone 2 are up. Most robberies occur very late evening or very early morning. Currently under investigation is a series of robberies in close proximity to ATM machines. Some victims have been forced to make ATM withdrawals. Increased traffic enforcement has been used to provide opportunities to stop suspicious vehicles. Reported auto larcenies are about even with last year, but auto larceny arrests are up over 200 percent, indicating successful enforcement.

In 2012 over 95,000 calls for service were received by AFD. EMS performed 84 successful resuscitations. There were only five fire-related deaths. Current initiatives include use of fire stations as a short-term "safe place" for at-risk individuals, such as victims of child abuse or other domestic violence. Fire hydrants are being serviced. Registration with "Smart 911" is voluntary but recommended, as the information received is used to aid responding EMS and/or

firefighters. Approximately 70 new firefighters have recently joined AFD. April 1 was celebration of 50th anniversary of racial integration of AFD.

Mr. Reid and Mr. Bozarth are each members of the Atlanta Civilian Review Board (ACRB), an advisory board to the Chief of Police which hears complaints of misconduct by law enforcement or corrections staff within the APD or the Atlanta jail. These complaints involve matters such as false imprisonment, abusive language, excessive force, etc. The ACRB was established by ordinance in 2007 as an independent agency to provide citizen oversight of misconduct accusations against sworn members of the APD and the Atlanta Corrections Department.

Crime Stoppers is a community-based non-profit organization aimed at removing criminals from the street. Crime Stoppers accepts on-line donations and also has an annual fundraiser, the Blue Jean Ball, to raise funds to use as rewards to citizens who supply tips to aid law enforcement in solving crimes. Lock doors. Keep valuables out of sight, especially in autos. Call Crime Stoppers at 404-577-TIPS to supply anonymous tips which will remain outside the public domain and thus not be subject to freedom of information (FOIA) requests. Thus far 171 arrests have come about as a result of tips supplied to Crime Stoppers Atlanta.

Kevin Leff, Esq. (Counsel for Scott Selig)

Mr. Leff reported regarding a "white paper" conceptual proposed ordinance to permit sales of wine and beer (but no distilled spirits) in certain areas along the Peachtree Street and Peachtree Road corridor which would otherwise be prohibited by the existing ordinance which requires 500 feet separation from residential areas. Mr. Leff distinguished "straight line" distances from "walking" distances. He plans to seek a general exemption along the Peachtree Street and Peachtree Road corridor for large retail centers with a minimum of 75,000 square feet of gross leasable space. He notes that the existing Publix and Trader Joes have special ad hoc "spot" exemptions.

NPU-B Action: A resolution was approved by vote of 22-1-0 indicating a general openness/receptiveness to considering a draft ordinance along the lines discussed.

Ms. Rutherford reported regarding proposed ordinance 13-0-0426 which would amend land subdivision ordinance to encourage "green infrastructure," including things such as narrowing required street width for new subdivisions and otherwise reducing impervious ground cover, and also proposed ordinance 13-0-0427 to define the circumstances under which new subdivisions are required to connect to the municipal sanitary sewer system rather than using private septic systems. The NPU-B members will review the draft legislation and vote during the next regular monthly meeting.
