## V-13-240: 4000 Arden Way DEFERRED

Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulations to increase the overall lot coverage from 40% (allowed) to 48.5% and the rear lot coverage from 25% (allowed) to 40%, and to reduce the rear yard setback from 20' (required) to 15' to build a pool and pool deck. Applicant seeks no other variances at this time.

#### V-13-211: 727 & 737 Miami Circle (The Painted Pin)

This is an appeal of administrative issuance of a SUP. The Miami Circle Merchants Association (MCMA) contends that proposal constitutes a restaurant and not a bowling alley. However, the plan includes twenty (20) lanes, and the NPU-B Zoning Committee determined that the bar and food service functions are ancillary and incidental to the main use as a bowling alley, such that The Painted Pin is a bowling alley and not a restaurant or bar within the meaning of SPI-15 Lindbergh Transit Station Area District Regulations.

NPU-B Action: By vote of 20-0-0 the NPU-B adopted the Zoning Committee findings that The Painted Pin is a bowling alley and not a restaurant or bar within the meaning of SPI-15 Lindbergh Transit Station Area District Regulations.
