- Overall reported crime is down five percent for the year, but auto larcenies continue to increase. 80% of auto larceny victims are not residents of the City of Atlanta, which shows that the "plain view" education campaign inside the City has been an effective deterrent. Prevent auto larcenies by not leaving purses, electronic devices, and other valuables visible in vehicles.
- Three new officers have been assigned to Zone 2.

Prosecution of recidivist offenders is a priority. Most Zone 2 crime is not committed by Zone 2 residents, so recidivism statistics are difficult to compile. Legislation provides that repeat offenders are to be given maximum sentence, but often the actual time served is much less. The Fulton County District Attorney's office had a 97% conviction rate on cases tried over past year.
