Mr. Tony Peters, reporting for LBI, CID and BATMA:

- Public input meetings are not yet set for Phases III and IV of the Peachtree Transformation Project. Phase III begins at Maple Drive and extends to West Shadowlawn Avenue. Phase IV begins at West Shadowlawn Avenue and ends at Sheridan Drive / Peach Shopping Center).
- Charlie Laudermilk Park construction to be completed by November, 2014.
- Grand funds being sought to develop new master plan, as current plan dates back to 2001.- PATH400 Trail Phase I (Tower Place to Old Ivy) to be completed by year end. Phase II (Old Ivy to Wieuca) to begin later this month and be complete by end of 2015. Start and completetion dates are not yet set for Phase III (Sydney Marcus Boulevard to Miami Circle).
- Lenox Loop medians will be enhanced to look similar to those on Peachtree Road.
- Lane closures planned on Peachtree Road for planting seasonal color on weekend of 10/25.
- Traffic study to be available in November compares October 2014 traffic flow on GA400 tollbooth area with October 2013 (prior to removal of the toll booth).

Mr. Peters reported a pilot program which supplies trauma kits to APD. Approximately 2/3 of law enforcement officer fatalities are caused by trauma-related blood loss. Trauma kits are intended to mitigate blood loss following shootings or other trauma. Kits are very compact (5x7 inches) and cost approximately \$50 each.
