To date, the Buckhead Coalition has delivered 645 first responder kits to police officers. The kits are \$50 each and fully tax deductible through partnership with the Atlanta Police Foundation.

Checks can be mailed to the Buckhead Coalition made payable to the Atlanta Police Foundation. Mr. Peters will send a template letter to the NPU B if individual neighborhoods are interested in fundraising to support additional kits. The trauma kits include a tourniquet and bandages with a blood clotting agent that are designed such that an officer can apply them without assistance. Mr. Garth also reported that Georgia Power had installed new LED lights throughout Buckhead that will increase safety.

Mr. Peters noted that Phase II of Path 400 is under construction. Additionally, a home at 519 Old Ivy was purchased and demolished so that the lot can serve as a new City Park and trail head. Livable Buckhead will start a new capital campaign to raise funds for the future sections of the trail and the construction order may depend on the fundraising efforts. There was a visioning/ stakeholders meeting held for the Phipps Boulevard and Wieuca Road area which Andrea Bennett attended. Ms. Bennett reported that the consultants presented three alternatives to improve traffic patterns in the area. The first alternative was better striping, the second alternative was considered to be awkward by the stakeholders, and the third alternative included development of a roundabout. Mr. Peters presented that the consultant would develop a traffic model for the first and third alternatives based on the stakeholder feedback. At the August meeting, Mr. Peters will have more information to share regarding the final feasibility study for a park over GA 400. There is no update eon the Piedmont and Habersham intersection improvement except that GDOT is resolving a conflict with a utility and the City of Atlanta. Since Charlie Loudermilk park opened, there has been positive feedback and the park will start to be more programmed. There were questions raised by Ms. Shepherd regarding access to the park. There were questions about the striping on Pharr Road and Mr. Peters responded that feedback had been positive.
