### Proposed municipal code amendments

There was no report from the Planning Office this month, but NPU-B board members discussed the following four proposed amendments which correspond to the following four proposed supplements to the Connect Atlanta and Cycle Atlanta plans, upon which the NPU-B will need to be prepared to vote at its next regular monthly meeting in July:

The following additional proposed municipal code amendments, each supplementing the existing Connect Atlanta Plan, will be presented for NPU vote at the July, 2015 monthly meeting:

# CDP-15-010 – An ordinance to adopt *Move Atlanta: A Design Manual for Active, Balanced, & Complete Streets.*

This was presented as a comprehensive street design manual intended to be less automobile-focused, and to ensure that streets are conducive to all forms of transportation and suitable for use by pedestrians and bicyclists.

# CDP-15-011 – An ordinance to *adopt Transit Oriented Atlanta: A Strategy for Advancing Transit-Oriented Development.*

This supplement to the Connect Atlanta Plan advocates a comprehensive transit-oriented development (TOD) plan for areas within one-half mile of an existing or proposed transit station with design strategies to include increased densities, mixed use, and pedestrian orientation.

## CDP-15-012 – An ordinance to adopt the *Cycle Atlanta Phase 1.0 Study*

This supplement to the Connect Atlanta Plan is an implementation strategy which proposes to create a connected network of high-quality bicycle infrastructure in the core of the city, including five cycling corridors extending from the Atlanta Beltline into the center of the city.

## CDP-15-013 – An ordinance to adopt *Cargo Atlanta: A Citywide Freight Study*

The Cargo Atlanta Study is a comprehensive freight study on the importance of all modes of freight in the City of Atlanta. The study updates the Freight Route Map and the freight-related capital project list.

Various members expressed concern regarding three of these four proposed supplements. The concerns focused around two points. Regarding CDP-15-011 (encouraging transit-oriented development (TOD) plans for areas within one-half mile of an existing or proposed transit station), the one-half mile radius includes numerous existing neighborhoods which are zoned single-family and could have severe adverse consequences for those neighborhoods. Regarding CDP -15-010 and CDP-15-012, there is concern that main artery surface streets, particularly Peachtree Road, are currently at maximum capacity and that all existing right of way is needed for automobiles lanes and pedestrian sidewalks. Some NPU members expressed concern that these supplements might be viewed as authority to reduce automobile lanes in order to create space for bicycle lanes or other alternative transportation.

Board members France Campbell, Abbie Shepherd, and Jim Cosgrove agreed to coordinate an ad hoc committee comprised of any/all interested NPU-B members which will work on a suggested response to be discussed at the next monthly meeting of the NPU-B in connection with its vote on these supplements.

Applicant seeks a special exception from the zoning regulations to construct a 2 story addition to an existing non-conforming detached duplex which is otherwise not allowed. Applicant seeks no other variances at this time.

V-15-78: 1070 Angelo Court. Approved 7-0-0

Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulations to reduce the west side yard setback from 10' (required) to 8' to allow for an addition to an existing SFD. Applicant seeks no other variances at this time.

V-15-086: 3085 West Andrews Drive. Approved 7-0-0 conditioned on house being elevated to the existing City of Atlanta code and that the State of Georgia stream buffer is approved by Atlanta Watershed department.

Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulations to reduce the east side yard setback from 15' (required) to 7' to construct a new SFD. Applicant seeks no other variances at this time.

V-15-087: 252, 254 Kinsey Court NE. Approved 7-0-0

Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulations to reduce the side yard setback from 7' (required) to 0'to allow for a 2nd story addition to an existing SFD. This is pending City Council legislation approval for a re-plat of the lot dimensions that are in conflict of the City's official cadastral maps. Applicant seeks no other variances at this time.

V-15-118: 3405 Roswell Road. Approved 7-0-0

Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulations to reduce the front yard setback from 35' (required) to 17.5' to construct a new 2 story SFD with basement. Applicant seeks no other variances at this time.

U-15-008: 130 West Paces Ferry Road. Approved 7-0-0

Applicant seeks a site plan amendment to a special use permit. Applicant seeks no other variances at this time.
