

# NPU-B Monthly Full Board Meeting Minutes October 2022

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 PM by Jefferson McConkey, NPU-B Vice Chairperson.

Mr. McConkey welcomed everyone. No media present.

# 4. REPORTS FROM CITY DEPARTMENTAL REPRESENTATIVES, ELECTED OFFICIALS, AND OTHERS IN AUDIENCE

#### Atlanta Police Department (APD)

Major Mitchell reports that Zone 2 is down 11% overall, all other zones are still seeing an increase. Major Mitchell reminded everyone that stats are available online. For the city overall, 50% of crimes are property crimes, with most being car thefts (many are running cars or key fobs left inside the car).

Burglaries and shoplifting are up over the last three months, particularly in retail spaces. Car break-ins continue to be an issue, though they are down year over year; less people are leaving valuables and guns in their cars, which makes a difference. APD has noticed that more are signing up for Connect Atlanta – he wanted to clarify that signing up for the service only alerts the police that a camera is in the area, not providing them unlimited access.

In the Buckhead shops area, there was a fight and a stabbing occurred; they have a lot of footage and good leads. Another incident, a victim noted he was robbed; the victim has returned to his home out of state and has not cooperated with investigators – police are continuing their investigation. There have also been two noise complaints in Buckhead Village after Labor Day (when off-duty patrol ended); APD is looking into reestablishing their extra duty and they have cited the restaurant for being open on Sunday after midnight.

Major Mitchell noted the upcoming events for Senior Safety (Friday, October 7 at Cathedral of St. Philip at 10A) and Faith & Blue Zone 2 Coffee with a Cop (Sunday, October 9 at Peachtree Presbyterian between services).

A board member asked about construction noise at 6AM; Major Mitchell advised she email the location and he will follow-up.

A board member asked about improper parking at construction sites, specifically on Blackland; Major Mitchell asked about no parking signs and advised she send an email with specifics.

A board member asked about drivers stopping in the middle of the street for pick-ups, deliveries, etc.; Major Mitchell noted that most are infractions by food delivery drivers, and they have communicated with the companies as well as cited the drivers with tickets.

A board member asked about the restaurants serving alcohol past their cutoff time; Major Mitchell noted there are undercover officers shopping to try to get served, and then they can ticket. APD notes this is a loophole in the system and they are working with the mayor's office to improve the process, with the goal to stop it at the application process or allow APD to intervene earlier.

A board member asked about issues with construction at the corner of Andrews and Roswell Roads; Major Mitchell asked he follow-up with an email to investigate who issued the permit and if it can be streamlined.
