Keeps track of repeat offenders, burglaries, quality of life crimes, etc. Continuing to identify specific individuals. An offender with 15 indictments is currently in custody awaiting trial. Recently arrested an individual involved in a carjacking at Lenox Mall. Was able to track the vehicle and arrested within 30 minutes of committing crime and will be indicted shortly. Arrest restriction event (April 29) – if anyone knows of someone with an arrest on their record that has had no action, this event is an opportunity to request that the arrest is expunged. City of Atlanta is beginning a new recycling public awareness program – "top 10 in the bin" – that lists what materials will be accepted. This will reinforce proper recycling and may result in fines for improper disposal.

Reminded us that city ordinances require us to bring in trash cans the day that solid waste is picked up in the neighborhood. If a crew is working in the neighborhood and sees trash cans that remain at the curb, may leave a warning sticker for residents. They are not policing neighborhoods but do this if other work brings them to an area where trash can are not appropriately removed from the curb.

The city has identified a glass recycling firm -- Ripple Glass - as a possible partner for glass recycling. Plan is to install drop-off bins around Atlanta area. They are seeking possible locations. Requires room about the square footage of two parking spaces.

Office of Sustainability received \$1M grant from Rockefeller Foundation to address resilience – response to stress (e.g., traffic) or shocks (e.g., ice storm). Stephanie Stuckey – chief resilience officer seeking information about major concerns. There is an online survey posted at ResilientAtlanta.org. Ms. Norton will come back to community and present results. Noted cyberterrorism as an emergent issue that the office had not anticipated.

#### Issues to be resolved:

- Paving Habersham between W. Wesley and Peachtree Battle; signs were left on the street after the paving was completed.
- Water at 2576 Peachtree large leak; combined with construction is creating more of a problem for right turn lane.
- Sheridan Drive public works installed no parking signs. 58 Sheridan Drive parking signs are placed too far from driveway.

Ms. Singleton noted that public works has outstanding service request records that require a disposition in order to be closed. She will e-mail a list of open service requests for us to review and potentially close. Encouraged everyone to use 311 so that a ticket is open and can be tracked more efficiently.

Ms. Singleton is transitioning her work to Officer Morgan. We thanked her for her service to NPU-B.

## 4. PRESENTATIONS

#### 5. PLANNER'S REPORT

Jessica has a wide range of housing options and are considering an adjustment to the R-5 zoning to allow 'tiny houses' on foundations. Tiny house feasibility study examined a range of issues (e.g., foundation, wheels, communities, micro-housing (small houses within developments). Current plats are designed for 'regular' single family housing. Research suggests some mismatch between household demographics and current housing stock. Councilman Hall and Planning wanted to explore options. Not feasible for current property configurations and are seeking alternatives. R-5 districts are not very prevalent in NPU-B (some in Peachtree Park and a few scattered in other areas). Ordinance will allow free-standing units less than 750 square foot units. Accessory usage in multi-dwelling parcels. Outlined ordinance.

Zoning Review Board – Public Meeting on April 13<sup>th</sup>. We can vote on ordinance in April meeting.

Jessica will send a copy of the redlined ordinance for our review prior to April meeting.

## Questions:

- Airbnb rentals prohibits commercial ventures of leasing on a non-long-term basis in accessory unit; does not prohibit rental of main house and owner living in accessory unit during short-term rental period.
- Will not be allowed to subdivide parcels will remain on main lot
- Parking on parcel; has to have enough space for a conforming parking space in back yard; any exception would be a variance
- Cannot combine duplex and accessory structure
- Restricted to two units main house and accessory unit
- Does not have to be owner occupied in R-5
- Some study of alternatives for other types of zoning may be a family model
- What is change from current zoning two-family zoning is more flexible than traditional duplex; option to make second residence a free-standing unit
- Conforming R-5 lot to divide into duplex can have two units on each lot (zero lot line) –
  this would result in 4 units; can do this now but new ordinance would give more
  flexibility on placement of building than current R-5 zoning. Flexibility comes
  somewhat from reduced setbacks
- Plumbing required to have all utility connections currently covered in R-5 ordinance
- Other models Decatur now allows accessory dwellings on all zoning classes

Another zoning ordinance is being proposed that will allow another category of industrial use that includes residential within industrial. The problem being addressed is fragmented industrial parcels in areas that are becoming residential. Ordinance now allows industrial properties more than 50 years old to be converted to We have received fact sheet but not full ordinance.

Public hearing is in May or June. Work on ordinance is ongoing. Wants comments on current state as they are writing the ordinance. NPU-B members pointed out problematic typographical error that requires that 'emit noxious lights and sounds'.

V-16-006 1010 East Club Lane NE

APPROVED WITH CONDITIONS

Applicant seeks a variance from the Zoning regulation for the following: (1) to allow an accessory structure to project in front of main house. (E. Brookhaven Drive frontage); (2) to exceed the maximum size allowed for an accessory structure from 30% to 39%; (3) to allow a parking bay/pad to be located in the required half-depth front yard where prohibited. Applicant seeks a Special Exception; to allow active recreation (swimming pool) to be located in a yard adjacent to a street.

#### V-17-011 2950 Slaton Dr NW

APPROVED WITH CONDITIONS

Applicant seeks a variance from the Zoning regulations to reduce the required rear yard setback from 30 feet to 15 feet 7 inches to allow for a swimming pool.

V-16-346 36 Highland Drive NE

APPROVED CONDITIONED TO SITE PLAN

Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulations to reduce the required west side yard setback from 7 feet to 3 feet 6 inches in order to allow for the construction of a new single family dwelling. Applicant seeks no other variances at this time.

V-17-004 762 Martina Drive NE

APPROVED CONDITIONED TO SITE PLAN

Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulations to (1) reduce the required east side yard setback from 7 feet to .5 feet and (2) reduce the required front yard from 35 feet to 19.5 for a 2<sup>nd</sup> story addition to an existing single family dwelling.

Laura Dobson – protesting action of Peachtree Hills Civic Association

Revised site plan with transfer of the Isackson property parcel to Ashton Woods. Was approved by association without notice to the neighborhood. Believes that neighborhood would not approve development because of a history of clear-cutting lots and loss of historic properties. Ashton Woods involved in court action involving properties. Supports original Isackson property plan that preserves 50% of tree canopy.

Peachtree Hills Civic Association does not have a statement on the concern at this time. France Campbell is not on the Peachtree Hills Civic Association board but represents the neighborhood at NPU-B and thus could not address the civic association process. NPU-B system does not regulate neighborhood process. We can provide community feedback and will do so in this situation. Ms. Dobson will prepare a paragraph and send to Andrea Bennett for review, distribution, and submission to Peachtree Park.
